

St Catherine's Hospice (Promotions) Ltd Lottery: Full Terms and Conditions:

1. These Terms and Conditions are the Lottery Rules. By entering the lottery, entrants agree to be bound by these rules.
2. This lottery is being promoted by and on behalf of St Catherines Hospice (Promotions) Ltd
3. For the purpose of the Gambling Act 2005, this lottery is defined as a 'Society Lottery.'
4. This lottery is licensed by the Gambling Commission
5. To enter the lottery, you must be a UK resident aged 16 (sixteen) or over.
6. There will be £4000 cash prizes every week although additional prizes could be offered from time to time.
7. All tickets shall be priced at £1.
8. All lottery entry sales are final and no refunds shall be made at any time. All entrants acknowledge that their payment of £1 per ticket to enter the lottery does not guarantee that they will win any prize.
9. The draw for the prizes will be made at our lottery management company's premises to be held weekly. You do not need to be present at the draw to win the lottery.
10. St Catherine's Hospice (Promotions) Ltd attributes, by law, a minimum of 20% of the gross proceeds of each lottery directly to St Catherine's Hospice (Lancashire) Ltd for patient care, although in effect the amount given is more in the region of 60-65%.
11. If a cash prize is awarded, this will be made by cheque in the name of the entrant only.
12. St Catherine's Hospice Ltd reserves the right in exceptional and unforeseen circumstances to substitute any of the non cash prizes acquired for the lottery for a similar prize at St Catherine's Hospice Ltd absolute discretion.
13. Full payment for each ticket must be received either in the form of cash or cleared funds before the ticket can be entered into the draw. Only tickets for which full payment has been received either in the form of cash or cleared funds is eligible to win the prize.
14. The winners of the lottery prizes will be notified by letter.
15. All entrants are solely responsible for providing St Catherine's Hospice (Promotions) Ltd with their accurate and up-to-date contact details and St Catherine's Hospice (Promotions) Ltd will be in no way liable for any failure or inability to contact any entrant due to any errors, omissions or inaccuracies in the contact details that the entrant has provided.  - any delays or failures in the Banking system used by St Catherines Hospice or the member.
 - any refusal by St Catherines Hospice (Promotions) Ltd to accept registration of an individual as a member or the cancellation of a member.
 - any failure to enter a chance into the draw.
 - any event beyond the reasonable control of St Catherines Hospice
20. Nothing within these terms and conditions shall create or should be construed as creating any form of contract between any entrant and St Catherines Hospice (Promotions) Ltd
21. Any complaints relating to the lottery should be sent in writing to St Catherines Hospice (Promotions) Ltd giving full details of the complaint and supporting documentation.
